A RESOLUTION OF THE ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL ASSEMBLY IN SUPPORT OF EFFORTS TO RESTORE THE EKLUTNA RIVER.

WHEREAS, the Native Village of Eklutna is the largest Denai'na settlement in the Municipality of Anchorage; and

WHEREAS, the Eklutna River historically was a major subsistence resource for the Eklutna People; and

WHEREAS, the Eklutna River has been in a badly degraded condition since 1929 due to hydropower dams and water diversions; and

WHEREAS, the Eklutna River still supports five species of salmon, including Cook Inlet king salmon and sockeye salmon, though in [greatly] diminished numbers from historical levels; and

WHEREAS, Eklutna Incorporated, the village corporation for Eklutna, is the largest landowner in the Municipality of Anchorage and owns most of the land along the Eklutna River and around Eklutna Lake; and

WHEREAS, Eklutna Inc., and the Eklutna people have made substantial contributions to the development of the Municipality of Anchorage through school sites, highways, parks, railroads, housing, powerlines and rights-of-way; and

WHEREAS, The Conservation Fund and Eklutna Inc., are collaborating on a \$7.5 million project to dismantle the Lower Eklutna River dam; and

WHEREAS, Little to no water flows out of Eklutna Lake into the Eklutna River because of water diversions for the Eklutna Power Project and the supply of approximately 86 percent of the drinking water for Anchorage and Eagle River; and

35 36 WHEREAS, Municipal Light and Power (ML&P), Chugach Electric Association, and Matanuska Electric Association (collectively the "Eklutna Power Purchasers") jointly own and operate the Eklutna Power Project [owns a 52% share of the Eklutna Power Project]; and

1	WHEREAS, The Eklutna Power Project often provides the least expensive
2	renewable power on the Railbelt; and
3	
4	WHEREAS, The Eklutna Power Purchasers are contractually obligated to
5	study and develop a proposed Fish and Wildlife program to address [ML&P is
6	legally obligated to mitigate for] the impacts of the Eklutna Power Project to fish
7	and wildlife, pursuant to the 1991 Fish & Wildlife agreement; and
8	
9	WHEREAS, Mayor Ethan Berkowitz and members of the Anchorage Assembly have
10	frequently expressed their support for wild salmon and Anchorage's desire to be a
11	"Salmon City;" now, therefore
12	
13	THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY RESOLVES:
14	
15	Section 1. The Assembly recognizes the contribution of the Eklutna people and
16	Eklutna Inc. to the development of the Municipality of Anchorage and supports the
17	efforts to restore the hydrology and fisheries of the Eklutna River subject to all
18	provisions of the Fish & Wildlife agreement of August 7, 1991.
19	
20	Section 2. The Assembly urges the Eklutna Power Purchasers to initiate a
21	consultation process, as defined in the 1991 agreement, [Municipal Light and
22	Power] to begin necessary studies early to examine [define] the impacts to fish
23	and wildlife of Eklutna Lake and Eklutna River hydropower operations [and to begin
24	collaborative efforts to restore water flows to the Eklutna River].
25	
26	Section 3. This resolution shall be effective upon passage and approval.
